According to Article 89.¹ of the Law on Judicial Power, the Judicial Council consists of 15 members – eight permanent members (officials) and seven elected members. The President of the Constitutional Court acts as a permanent member of the Judicial Council.

A permanent member (official) may authorize another person to participate in a meeting of the Judicial Council.
